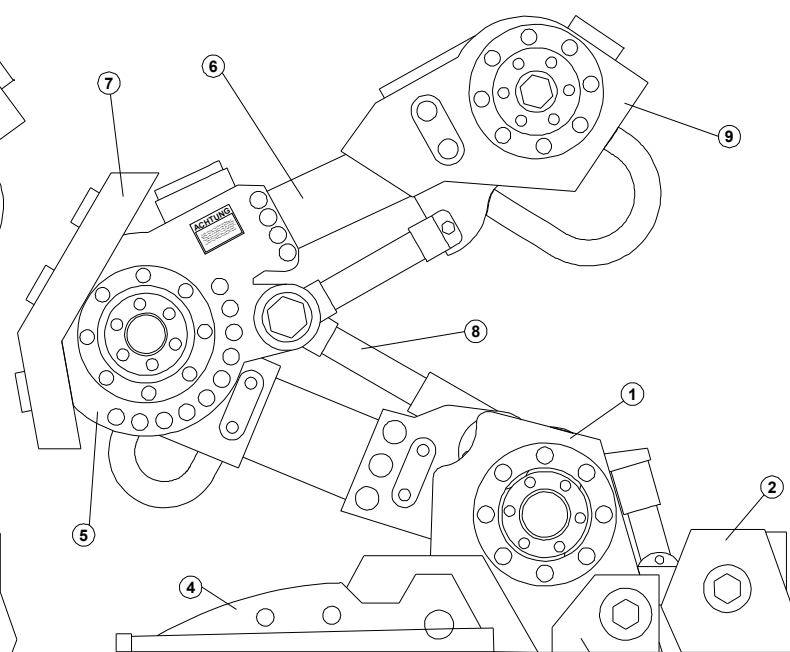
For years now, **Axis** engineers have expanded on the initial walker design that started it all, the original **Luther**. It was designed by **Baron Leopold Von Thaler**, one of the 20th century's **greatest** minds. Unfortunately for the **Axis**, the Baron is no more, but his followers do their best to expand on his work, and in the case of the **JagdLuther**, this process has been a great success. Officially known as the **Sonderkraftfahrzeug 199/4 schwer Panzerkampffläufer IV-D**, the **JagdLuther** is already known as one of the **deadliest** walker-killers on the planet. Its main **armament** is a pair of **7.5cm Fuß-Panzer-Kanone Zwillling 45 (FpkZw, Walking Twin Tank Guns)** guns. These weapons were **70** calibres long, derived from the armament of the **Panther** tank. They possess an amazing **accuracy** thanks to a new sighting system and their **very high** muzzle velocity. The thicker, better sloped front **armour** is also a big improvement over the **Luther** and **Ludwig**. The model presented here shows **Koenigstoten** pattern, used in liberation of southern Italy in summer 1945.
